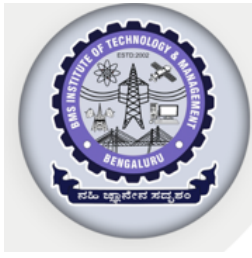

The event was led and executed successfully under the guidance of Mrs. Shwetha Rajeev. This event was organised with the objective to create awareness among the female students about the importance of Menstrual Hygiene and how to develop one’s personality. The event was successful enough to attract more than 100 students.

Mrs. Shwetha Rajeev is a master trainer of soft skills & a motivational speaker who has an overall experience of 15 years in soft skill training. In the first half of the session, she discussed about how to develop our personality. We would like to thank the principal and management for their timely advice and co-operation for organising this event. Few glimpses of the event as follows;



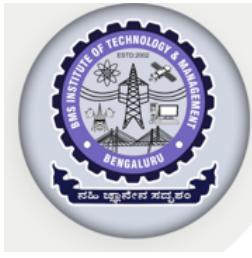
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## Debate Competition

The purpose of the extempore competition was to highlight the importance of Gender Equality and how it is a human rights issue. The event was open to all students of BMS Institute of Technology and Management. The registrations were limited to 16 and 14 registered participants participated in the event. The judges were: Prof. Durga Bhavani and Dr. Chandrashekhara

A video was shown to each pair and were given sufficient time to ponder upon. Randomly the participants were asked to choose a chit from the pool of chits numbered from 1 to 14. Then in the serial order of the chits chosen the pairs were called upon to present their views. Each pair was given a maximum time limit of 5 minutes. The judges evaluated on the following criteria: organization & clarity, use of argument, presentation style and vocabulary. Each criteria was evaluated out of 10. At the end of the first round 4 students were shortlisted for the final decision. Alumni of our college was invited. For the final decision he gave a scenario to all the shortlisted participants and were asked to present their views on the same. 3rd Place: - Poorna N S - 5th Semester, Department of ISE and Chaitanya M 7th Semester, Department of ISE.



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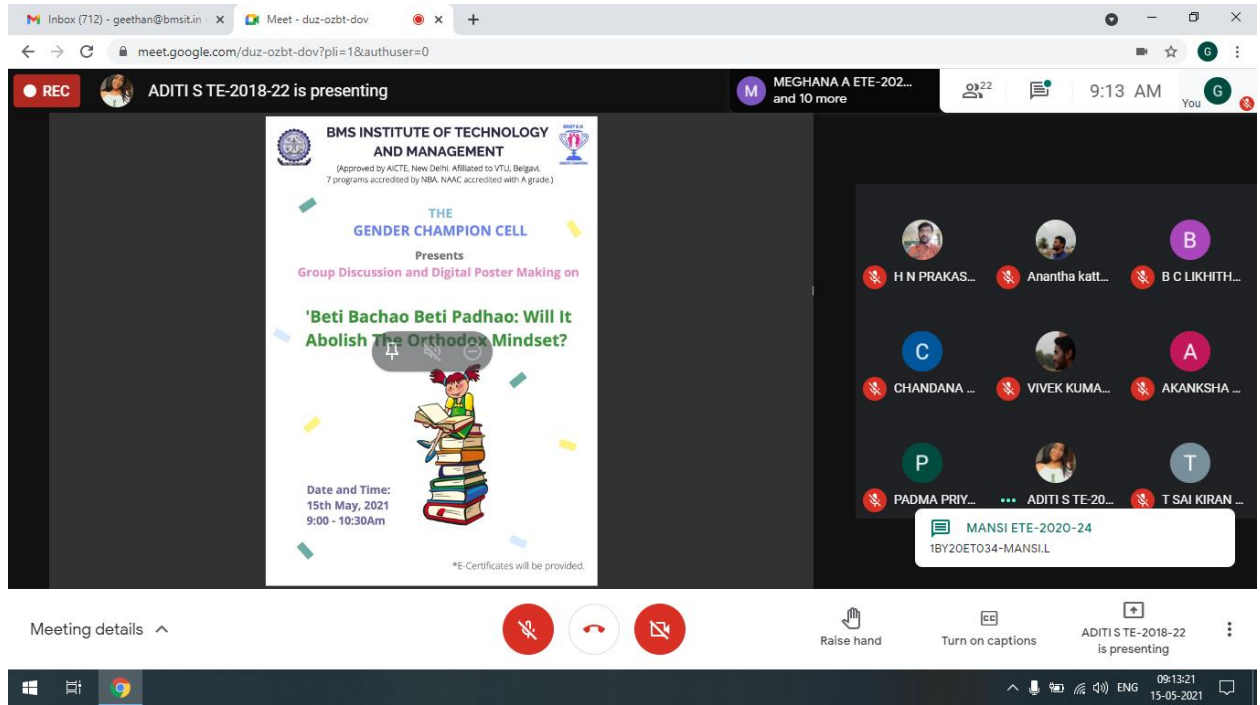


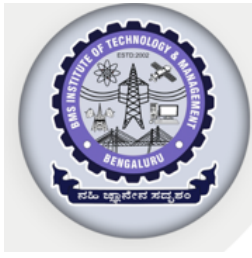
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## Group discussion and Digital poster making

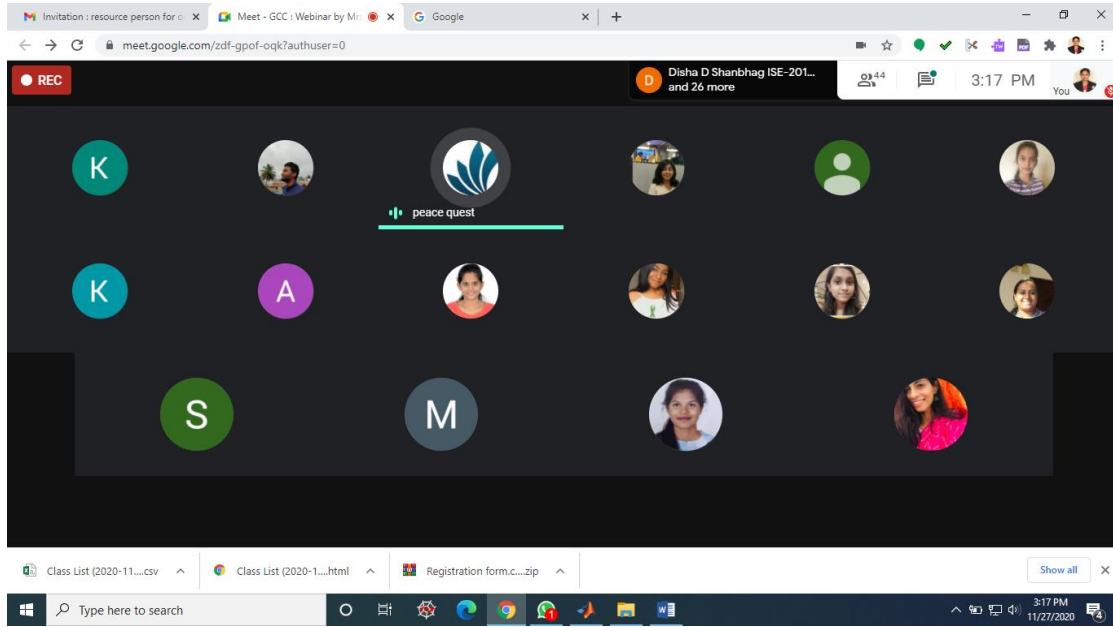

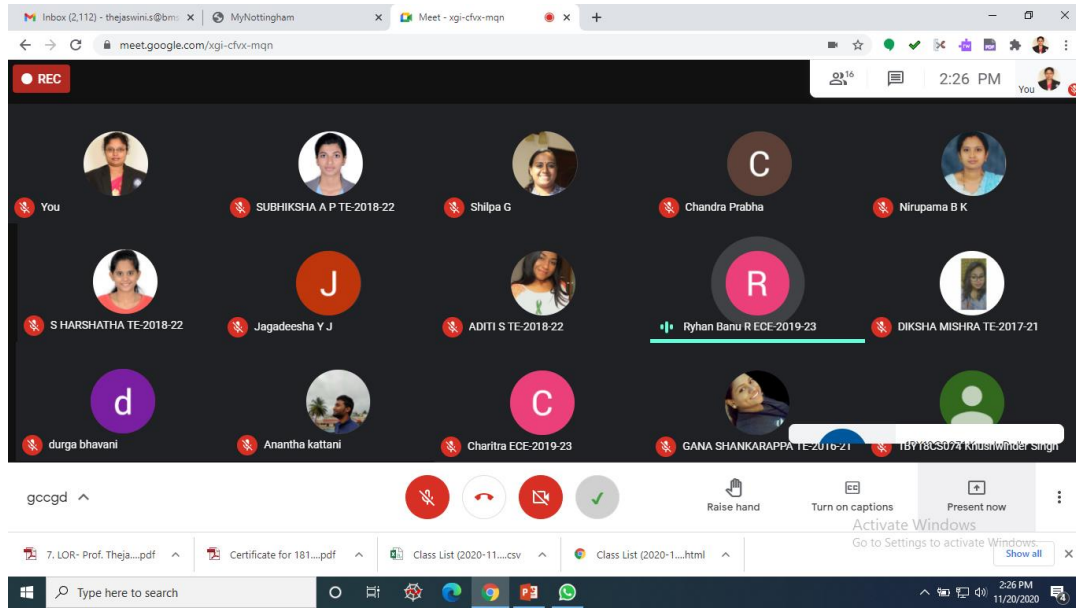

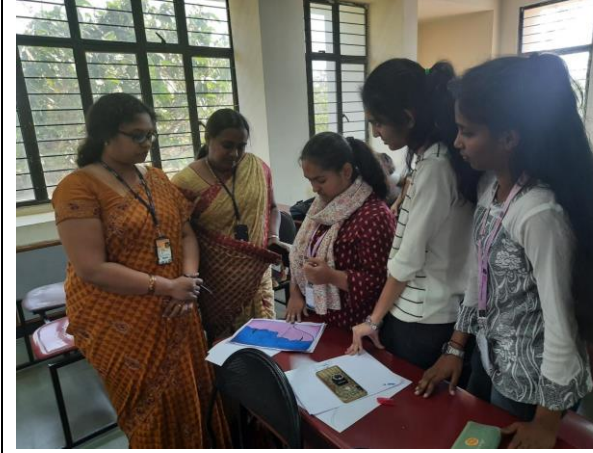
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### **Debate competition:**
