Report on the Audit of Financial Statements

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Trust'sability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to goingconcern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intendsto cease operations or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Trusteesare responsible for overseeing the Trust's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Other Matter

Corresponding figures for the year ended 31 March 2022 have been audited by another auditor who has expressed an unmodified opinion dated 29.09.2022 on the financial statements of the trust for the year ended 31 Mar 2022.

Our opinion on the financial statement is not modified in respect of the above matter.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND NOTES ON ACCOUNTS

I Significant Accounting Policies

1. BMS Institute of Technology (BMSIT) established in September 2003 is a branch of B.M.Sreenivasaiah Educational Trust (BMS Trust). The institution follows accrual system of accounting.

The institute is collecting contribution from employees for Family Welfare Fund and the same is reflected as balance of fund in the financial statements. Payment to eligible employees is considered as expense in the year of payment and no provision is made for the same in the books of accounts.

- 2. Tuition fee is recognised as income on the basis of approved fee structure for the year.
- 3. Fixed assets are accounted at cost of acquisition.
- 4. Depreciation on Fixed Asset is provided under written down value method on Monthly pro-rata basis as per the rates prescribed in the Income Tax Act, 1961
- 5. Grants related to specific fixed assets are shown separately as Grants in the Balance Sheet. Fixed assets acquired through the grant funds are shown as grant assets and no depreciation is claimed on the same. Revenue / recurring grants are credited to Income & Expenditure account to the extent of expenses incurred.

Il Notes to Accounts

- 1. The notes pertains to the following units, for which separate financial statements are prepared.
 - a) BMS Institute of Technology & Management (BMSIT)
 - b) BMSIT Placement,
 - c) BMSIT Transportation, and
 - d) BMSIT Hostel
- According to the management, BMSET and various colleges and accounting entities thereof
 exists solely for the purpose of education and no part of these activities is
 commercial/industrial/business in nature and consequently relevant accounting standards
 issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India are not mandatory and hence not
 applicable.



- Balance under BMS Trust is subject to reconciliation and consequent rectification.
- 4. BMS Trust has incurred certain capital expenditure on behalf of BMSIT. Such expenditure is accounted in BMSIT purely based on the communication from BMS Trust and related supporting will be maintained at BMS Trust level.
- 5. Certain portion of the fees from students is received at head office and such amount is recognised as income in the head office books of accounts.
- 6. Fees from students is being received through online transfer. However certain receipts are still under reconciliation to be set off with the fees receivable. Pending reconciliation such receipts is netted off in the fees receivable in the financial statements. Further in respect of Transport division such receipts are more than fees receivable amount and accordingly shown as liability.
- 7. Certain deposits and fee refundable amounts to old students is continuing in the books of accounts. Care is being taken to refund the same to the respective students. Pending such refund the liability is continued in the financial statements.
- 8. Deposits and EMD from Vendors is kept as caution against work done by them and will be refunded after the agreed upon period and satisfaction of work done. The liability continued in the financial statements, pending claim application from the respective vendors.
- Previous year figures have been regrouped wherever necessary to make them comparable with the current year figures. Previous year figures are audited by a firm other than M/s.Sundaresh & Co., Chartered Accountants.
